

Call for Papers

The Federal Housing Finance Agency (FHFA) will host an Econ Summit on Climate-Related Risks to Housing at the Agency's headquarters in Washington, DC on **Tuesday, November 12, 2024**.

The Agency welcomes and encourages the submission of a broad range of research work. Topics include, but are not limited to: capitalization of natural disaster risk, loan performance in the wake of natural disasters, migratory responses to climate change, insurance and its relationship to homeownership burdens, the relationship between improved building codes and climate resiliency to housing market outcomes, energy efficiency and/or home performance improvements for both single-family and multifamily housing, and the effects of the transition away from fossil fuels on regional housing markets.

Papers are welcome from, but are not limited to, the fields of economics, real estate studies, and finance.

The deadline for submissions is 5:00 PM ET on **Friday**, **April 19**, **2024**. Decisions regarding accepted papers will be communicated by the end of July.

Authors may submit complete papers or detailed abstracts that include preliminary results and a disclosure statement, following the <u>AEA disclosure policy</u>. The cover page of each submission must include the paper title, abstract, authors, affiliations, and contact information including e-mail address(es).
