The FHFA Fall Economic Summit is coming to Constitution Center on Tuesday, October 3rd. This semi-annual Summit event will focus on Climate Risk.

Presented in a hybrid format, there are both in-person and virtual (Zoom) attendance options. The in-person event begins with registrant sign-in at 8:30 am. The Summit then kicks-off at 9:00 am with opening remarks by DRS Deputy Director Daniel E. Coates and FHFA Director Sandra Thompson.

In Session 1, researchers will share their analyses and insights on climate change and insurance. Presentations will be given by Katherine Wagner, Assistant Professor, University of British Columbia; Penny Liao, Fellow, Resources for the Future; Ishita Sen, Assistant Professor of Business Administration, Harvard Business School; and Hyeyoon Jung, Financial Research Economist, Federal Reserve Bank of New York.

In Session 2, we will welcome several academics as they provide their analysis on the effects of building codes, land use regulations, and disclosures. Presentations will be given by Logan Blair, Postdoctoral Research Associate, University of Washington; Douglas Noonan, Paul H. O'Neill Professor, O'Neill School, Indiana University Purdue University Indianapolis; and Seunghoon Lee, Assistant Professor, University of Missouri-Columbia.

Lunch will be held from 1:10 pm - 2:10 pm. Food and beverages will be provided by FHFA.

In the afternoon, we will have a third session where researchers will present their analyses on disaster risk and house prices. These presentations will be given by Travis LaHue, Economist, Federal Energy Regulatory Commission; Hoanh Le, Postdoctoral Researcher, South Dakota State University; Xudong "Sean" An, Vice President, Supervision, Regulation, and Credit, Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia; and Justin Contat, Senior Economist, FHFA.

The Summit concludes with closing remarks by DRS Deputy Director Daniel E. Coates after which there will be a networking reception from 4:15 pm - 5:30 pm.
